Bryan Reece	Dr. Reece gave a presentation on the success of Dual Enrollments in the following high schools:

	<p>Programs for Corona, Santiago, and California Virtual Academies (CAVA) are being developed.</p> <p>Dual enrollment allows high school students to complete college units without any charge to the student or parents. Research shows many low income high school graduates plan to attend college, but never enroll. Through dual enrollment a high school student could complete high school and receive a diploma and an AA degree when they graduate. This incentive has proven to work and is becoming more popular for areas who want to upskill their future workforce. Norco College Dual Enrollment is aligned to meet the goals for the Riverside County WDB Goals, which are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meet the current and future workforce needs of targeted and key industry sectors. • Engage industry partners in robust ways to inform trailing needs, curriculum ad skills gap issues • Significantly reduce the number of long term unemployed and disconnected young adults and other groups that lack access to the workforce. • Expand the use of apprenticeships as a work-based learning strategy. • Continue to establish and bring recognition to the WDB as the focal point between employees, employers, education, economic and community development.

Ron Painter Jeffery Brown Ron O’Brien	<p>Bertelsmann Foundation is a nonprofit and nonpartisan think tank dedicated to promoting and strengthening the transatlantic alliance. Through various methods the Foundation provides analysis and solutions to economic, political, and social challenges impacting the United States and Europe.</p> <p>Technology is rapidly reshaping industries, economies and the world of work. It is too soon to predict how technology and automation will eliminate or create jobs, these changes will impact communities and workers differently. The Riverside WDB was chosen as Case Study to facilitate a conversation on how our areas is dealing with the future of work.</p> <p>Jeffery Brown, Manager, Future of Work & Artificial Intelligence lead the group in a conversation where he told the group to reflect on the impact of technology and automation on our local economy and labor market, and then he asked the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are you optimistic about? • What are you concerned about? • How should your community position itself for the jobs and opportunities of the future? • Who should take the lead in training and retraining workers and students? Why? <p>After this portion of the case study was complete he asked the group to think about overall responsibility for skilling and workforce development, and where should the responsibility lie now and 10 years into the future.</p> <p>The study is scheduled to be complete by the winter of 2018, all project findings will be available through a website containing video photos, infographics and written reports www.bfna.org/project/future-of-work .</p>
